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Walking Dusty... teacher: Dan and Scott

Many at Mosaic share the passion to work in Haiti to build homes. There are children that are needlessly malnourished and suffering from preventable diseases, and there's so much work to do there. But don't get the wrong idea. Not everyone is called to serve in Haiti. "God has given every follower of Christ natural avenues to spread the gospel and declare his glory." (*Radical Together*, p. 65) So God has a plan for how He wants to use us, but it's different for each of us.

Sometimes I get hung up on why or how God wants to use me. I feel inadequate. (I think: *I'm sure someone else could do a better job.*) I question whether God remembers how I failed in another area. (*Certainly God knows that I messed that up before.*) But God's not interested in only the things we do really well. What He wants is our heart and faith-like obedience.

Scott ended the message by asking how we will do our part. Here are a few more ideas: Will you do your part to adopt a College Life student? Will you do your part to feed hungry children? Will you do your part to be a foster parent? Will you do your part to share with the homeless? Will you do your part to lead by being single? Will you do your part to mentor a teen? Will you do your part to talk to others at work about Jesus? Will you do your part to sponsor a child in school? Will you do your part to lead your family? Will you do your part to adopt? Will you do your part to plant a church? Will you do your part to put Jesus first? Remember, it's not just about Haiti. It's about trusting that God wants to use you and then taking that step of faith and allowing Him to do it.

Questions to Consider:

The Greatest Commandment is "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. And love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:37, 39) Who is my neighbor?

How has God already gifted me? Am I serving in this area? What's an area that I don't feel gifted, and yet I believe God is calling me to serve there?

In Old Testament days, people had to go somewhere to be in the presence of God. What does it mean that God dwells in me? What does it mean for the world that God dwells in me?

How much of my understanding of the Gospel is American? How much of my understanding of the Gospel is Biblical? How will I get a right understanding of the Gospel?

Am I equipped to lead unbelievers to Christ? Am I equipped to show new believers how to live as followers of Christ?

Am I following God's purpose for my life? Will my life count? Will I do my part?
